Who or what originally inspired you to get involved as a volunteer/leader with ACTE?

My professor at The University of Georgia, Dr. John Scott, first introduced me to our association and suggested that I attend my first convention. Without him and my mentor, Cynthia Greene, I would not have started on my leadership journey and met Jean Kyle, former ACTE Business Education Division Vice President, who inspired me to run for a position on the ACTE Board. As I travel and promote the value of ACTE, I always work the power of mentorship into my presentations. Without mentors and without people helping the next set of leaders along, we would not be where we are today as an association.

What do you hope to accomplish through volunteering?

For example, I recently spoke with a cabinet member of a school district on the other side of the country who saw my name on the ACTE website and wanted to know about CTE best practices as they are looking to reform. Without my volunteer experience, I would not have been able to connect them with amazing people and programs in our CTE community to visit and speak with.

What's the best advice you've been given?

Throughout my life, my Dad always emphasized the importance of having a plan...and a plan B...and plan C. In addition to this plan, you need to know how to be adaptable and adjust to still win the war even if you have lost the immediate battle, so to speak. I think that as a society, we get bogged down with all of the "to do" list items and emails that we do not take the time to step back and plan.
