This program is the result of a 3-way public/private partnership among Missouri Western State University in St. Joseph, Missouri; Rocky Mountain Chocolate Factory in Durango, Colorado; and Steven L. Craig, entrepreneur, CEO of Craig Realty Group in Newport Beach, CA, and benefactor of the Craig School of Business at MWSU. The goal of the collaboration is the "creation" of entrepreneurs — graduates of the MWSU School of Business — who will own and operate RMCF stores. Each year, seniors in good standing in the Craig School of Business compete to own/operate a Rocky Mountain Chocolate Factory store. Currently, 7 stores are operating in 6 states with an 8th store set to open in November. The competition involves passing an applied entrepreneurship business class and writing and presenting a business plan to a panel of judges which includes university officials, entrepreneurs, RMCF representatives, and Steven Craig. Typically, more than one store is awarded each spring. Come learn more about this unique program that enables students to become entrepreneurs, sooner rather than later.
