Brief Summary of Session: Brenda Bell and Lori Williamson-Dean will present a training session in order to distribute Curriculum to teachers for use in their classroom. The training will be offered for college credit through the University of Central Missouri. Curriculum is provided FREE of charge through sponsorship with the Department of Health and Senior Services.

This session is a curriculum implementation course based on “An Ounce of Prevention – Addressing Birth Defects Related to Folic Acid, Tobacco & Alcohol” The key concepts addressed will be: Prenatal development, the causes and impacts of birth defects; Folic Acid: definition, function and sources; reduction vs. prevention of neural tube defects; impact on general health; Alcohol use during pregnancy; fetal alcohol syndrome- characteristics and impact; Risks of tobacco use during pregnancy; associated risks of post natal tobacco use; and Pre conception planning; elements of a healthy pregnancy; prenatal screening and diagnosis and genetic counseling. The workshop will include classroom activities, assessments and resources for teachers and students.

Brief Summary of Session: The Money Circle curriculum target audience is high school students ranging from 9th to 12th grade. Included in this series of lesson plans are print and Web-based resources from the Federal Reserve System focusing on four concepts: 1) interpreting the history, functions and characteristics of money; 2) evaluating the significance of learning, earning and responsible spending on personal financial well-being; 3) applying financial planning and budgeting mechanisms; and 4) analyzing the role and tools of the Fed in ensuring a healthy, growing and stable economy and how the Fed affects the nation's money supply. The concepts explored in the lessons address the essential question:

“How does the Federal Reserve promote a stable economic environment enabling consumers to make informed personal financial decisions?”

Teachers attending this hands-on interactive session will experience the curriculum through lesson simulations and activities preparing them to immediately integrate Money Circle in their curriculum. Each teacher will receive the curriculum on CD, associated classroom materials, supplemental Federal Reserve resources, and the opportunity to “win” prizes, and much more!
