

What's Cooking? Breakfast Pizza

1 (8 ounce) can refrigerated crescent rolls
1 pound bulk pork sausage
1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese
3 eggs
1/4 cup milk
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese

Unroll crescent dough and place on a greased 12-in. pizza pan; press seams together and press up sides of pan to form a crust. In a skillet, brown sausage

pan; press seams together and press up sides of pan to form a crust. In a skillet, brown sausage over medium heat; drain and cool slightly.

- Sprinkle sausage and cheddar cheese over crust. In a bowl, beat eggs, milk and pepper; pour over pizza. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese.
- Bake at 375 degrees for 28-30 minutes or until golden brown. Let stand 10 minutes before cutting.


