CTE Standards Revision & Trainings

Educator workgroups met over the summer in the following content areas to revise CTE course standards: Agriculture Food & Natural Resources, Arts, AV Technology & Communication, Finance, Health Science, Human Services, and Manufacturing. The revised standards are currently out for industry review and validation.

for industry review and validation. Final drafts of the revised standards will be available for public comment in mid-October at http://doe.sd.gov/ContentStand ards/review.aspx. We encourage you to provide either online or inperson feedback on theses standards. The first public hearing for the revised standards will be on November 15, at the SD Board of Education meeting in Sioux Falls. Three more public hearings will take place during winter/spring of 2017, and the standards will be up for adoption in May 2016.

In-person trainings and webinars for the newly adopted standards in Architecture & Construction,
Education & Training, Foundations of CTE, Information Technology,
Law, Public Safety, Security & Corrections, and STEM will be held throughout the year. Dates for these training can be found at http://doe.sd.gov/octe/document-s/PD16-17Cl.pdf.

2016 SDACTE Award Winners

New Teacher of the Year---Kristi Knox, FACS teacher from Canistota

Having completed her third year of teaching, Ms. Knox uses project-based learning opportunities to help students develop leadership, community involvement, teamwork, and growth as a person. A few of those projects include Food Truck Challenge, Chopped Wars, and Cupcake Wars. She also serves as the local FCCLA advisor where her chapter plans and carries out many community events.

Teacher of the Year---Naome Poppe, FACS teacher from Brandon

Teaching students useful information that they can use throughout their lives is something Mrs. Poppe tries to do for her students. She uses a variety of resources in her teaching, incorporates technology as much as possible, and makes sure she meets the CTE standards. She has sent 4 high school students to the FACS program at SDSU and supervised 3 student teachers in her career. This is her 13th year of teaching with the past 8 in SD.

Postsecondary Teacher of the Year---Dr. Scott Smalley, Department of Teaching, Learning, and Leadership

Dr. Smalley served as an assistant professor in the area of agricultural education at SDSU before just recently accepting a similar position in lowa. He has worked with several projects with the most recent one where he designed and received approval from the SD Board of Regents and SDSU to begin a Masters of Science in Ag Education. Another project he assisted in organizing and hosting is a one-day recruitment event entitled iTeachU.

Carl Perkins Community Service Award---Cindy Brace, FACS teacher from Redfield

For the past 33 years of teaching FACS and advising, Mrs. Brace has integrated community service into class and FCCLA activities. A few of the projects she has lead and supervised include serving Veterans Day meals, conducting yearly food drives, angel tree collections, fundraiser for C is for Cookie Not Cancer, helped the local PTSA put on elementary carnival games and book fairs, and made and donated tie blankets for the needy.

Lifetime Achievement Award---Jean Clarke, Emery

Since 1977 Mrs. Clark has been involved in CTE at the local and state level. She retired from teaching in 2015, but continues to be involved in teaching DIAL courses, serves as a Peer Education Leader in FCCLA, and is the Healthy Youth Initiative Coordinator. She has helped revise standards in 2 clusters, served as a cooperative teacher for 12 student teachers and served as the chair of the SDACTE Awards Committee; plus advised FCCLA officers at the district, state, and one at the national level.
