Three more public hearings will take place during winter/spring of 2016, and the standards will be up for adoption in May 2016. After Gov. Daugaard selected Blue Ribbon Task Force members comprised of legislators, State Department of Education

staff, educators and stakeholders, the task force has met twice since the SDACTE Conference held at the end of July with plans to meet on Oct. 1.

To date, no recommendations have been put forth although many options have been discussed.

The Task Force has reviewed statistics related to the number of teachers employed at the elementary, middle school and high school level as well as the number of assistant principals, principals, and superintendents.

Task Force members also reviewed retirement projections for the next five years as well as projected student enrollment.

Other topics reviewed by the Task Force include teacher preparation program enrollment/graduation, K-12 enrollment projections and student/teacher ratios.

Mrs. Roudabush works diligently to develop curriculum that is rigorous and provides real-world experiences. To maximize her students' learning potential, she has created a Layered Curriculum to meet the kinesthetic, visual, auditory, and other learning styles of her students.

She involves her students and FFA members in the community service projects and by inviting businesses to her classroom.

Teacher of the Year – Joe Dalton, Exploration Career Instructor from Northeast Technical High School in Watertown, SD

Through the career cluster courses that Mr. Dalton teaches, he provides opportunities for freshmen and sophomores to learn about career and technical education. He uses CEV software for students to learn about the careers, education, and skills needed in each cluster area. Students then perform hands-on projects like constructing a garden shed, wood duck houses, and egg drop structures or remodeling an office space. He involves his students in service learning projects like staining millwork for two Habitat for Humanity houses that were completed in Watertown.

Postsecondary Teacher of the Year – Dr. Deb DeBates, Teacher Educators in Teaching, Learning, and Leadership Department in the College of Education and Human Sciences at SDSU

Dr. DeBates is committed to students, education and her profession which is evident in all that she does. She treats students and fellow professionals with high respect and motivates them to work to their highest potential. Through her enthusiasm and creative motivational techniques and teaching style, she captivates her students', colleagues', and workshop participants' interest.
