Their selection is a testament to their dedication, commitment and passion for career and technical education.

Neither Rist nor Rieck was able to attend the conference. However, Tracy Kern surprised Rieck on Sunday night at the advisor meeting at the Ramkota during the state FCCLA convention. "What a surprise to be awarded this at our FCCLA's Advisors to Action meeting! I am truly humbled to receive this honor when there are so many other deserving CTE educators. CTE has been and continues to be such an important part of my life. Thank you from the bottom of my heart!" Rieck said.

Rist had this reaction to his honor: "I've always been an advocate for community service involvement from the local FFA chapter's that I've worked with over the years. I'm proud of my students' accomplishments and believe that their sense of responsibility and involvement that they get from working with all levels of local service groups and leadership in the process is an essential part of our success. Our chapter officers take pride in being the group in our community that people come to when they want to 'make things happen."

The Region V winners will progress as national finalists in their categories. The national winners will be announced at the ACTE Awards Banquet, a dinner and award presentation recognizing the best CTE educators in the country, which will take place on Wednesday evening, November 30th, during ACTE's CareerTech VISION 2016 in Las Vegas.
