Spring Thaw for CTE

As the winter and the discussions of budgets drag on, it can be easy to fall into the trap of believing that things might never warm up. It's true education is experiencing some difficult times right now; I wouldn't begin to downplay the seriousness of the decisions being made in the statehouse or school board room. However, I do think those of us in the CTE world have a few things to be proud of and plenty to look forward to. In the last school year our CTE concentrators graduated at a rate of 97%. Those same students were placed at a rate of more than 96%, with 75% going on to postsecondary education (more than half of those at 4 year universities). Those are big numbers to be proud of. That's not to say we don't still have work to do, especially when it comes to the math and reading attainment of our students, but nonetheless we're proving again that CTE works for students.

You say, "That's great, but who is listening?" Well those who listened to Governor Daugaard's State of the State Address would have heard a lot of things that sounded very familiar. He spoke of his commitment to expanding technical education opportunities, and ensuring that students are prepared to enter and graduate from college. He talked about increasing student exposure to STEM, and the need for healthcare workers with a range of educational experiences. With last year's graduation requirement changes, and comments like that from our Governor, we're in a better position now to come out of the challenges facing us than we've ever been before.

As we come out of this downturn CTE is well placed to grow and reach even more students. As a way to help lay that ground work I'm happy to announce that we'll be making funds available to cover one administrator's registration per school to attend conference with their teachers. Space is limited, watch for more registration information in the next few months. Keep warm; Spring is on the way.
