The Pennsylvania economy is experiencing a skills gap...

42% of Pennsylvania workers are trained at this level.

Career and technical education (CTE) programs can fill these gaps, particularly in Pennsylvania's key industries, like:

- natural gas
- manufacturing
- agribusiness
- tourism



86% of Pennsylvania postsecondary CTE concentrators earned an industry-recognized credential, certificate or degree in 2018.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Pennsylvania, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based experiences with industry partners. During the 2019-20 school year, Pennsylvania had:


