As you strive for safety and health in this time of uncertainty, I wish you strength and daily moments of joy with those around you.



Nancy Shepard, president of NATEFACS prepared these notes for the webinar regarding Online Learning:

Ways to empower our students include helping them with self-regulated learning. Students have the ability to control and be responsible for their academic achievement. Successful learners develop skills pertaining to motivation, setting goals, planning and contingency plans to take charge of their learning. Zimmerman and Risemberg (1997) identified six dimensions of



learning important to self-regulatory skills, motivation, methods of learning, use of time, physical environment, social environment and performance. Students using self-regulated learning successfully develop skills and strategies, such as self-talk to facilitate performance, reflection and monitoring practices to facilitate their own learning. Goal setting is a key factor in social and academic settings and has implications for learning environments. Students are taught to recognize problem situations and stop and rethink before acting.


AAFCS


