CTE in Louisiana

The Louisiana economy is experiencing a skills gap...

of jobs in Louisiana require skills training—
more education than high school but less than a four-year degree.

46% of Louisiana workers are trained at this level.

Career and technical education (CTE) programs can fill these gaps, particularly in Louisiana's key industries, like:

- advanced manufacturing
- energy
- automotive
- agribusiness



The number of industryrecognized credentials earned in Louisiana has tripled since the introduction of the Jump Start program, reaching 900,000 in 2017-18.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Louisiana, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based experiences with industry partners. During the 2019-20 school year, Louisiana had:



These youth and adult learners in CTE programs are more engaged, graduate high school at higher rates, earn industry-recognized credentials, and have rewarding and family-sustaining careers.
