This statement will appear on the Region I website.




### Region I Conference

This year the Conference is being held in partnership with ACTE, ACTE Region I, New York State Association for Career and Technical Education (NYSACTE) and the United Federation of Teachers (UFT). The Conference will be held **March 11–13** in NYC. The Borough of Manhattan Community College (MCC) UFT headquarters will be the sites for the main conference sessions. The Preconference is ACTE Connect which will take place on Wednesday afternoon at

MCC. The conference sessions will take place on Thursday at MCC, beginning with a keynote from Bill Daggett, founder and chairman of the International Center for Leadership in Education. He will speak on "Creating Future-focused Schools." We've already confirmed seven breakout workshop sessions for Thursday. These sessions received high ratings at previous Region I conferences, so the speakers were invited to present again this year. In addition, we are evaluating the other proposals submitted to present on Thursday. Early Thursday evening, we will move the UFT satellite facility in Brooklyn for the awards ceremony, which will end by 8:00 p.m. On Friday, we will meet at the UFT headquarters for a brief General Session and then leave for site visits to High School of Fashion Industries, Food and Finance, Art and Design High School, John Bowne High School, New York Harbor School, High School of Economics, and Brooklyn STEAM Center. Transportation will be provided for the awards ceremony and site visits.


### Region I Awards

Nominations for 2020 ACTE awards are now being accepted through **March 1** on the ACTE website.



# ACTE Region I Leadership Opportunities



## Explore the Full Spectrum of WBL Experiences




ACTE's new National Work-based Learning Conference, cohosted with the Iowa Work-based Learning Organization, is focused on supporting the delivery of quality experiences
