
### Thank You for Your Leadership





The "Unconscious Bias Quiz" that we completed, was a good starting point for me to look at my old assumptions and then the speakers gave us some new perspectives to try.

The conference wasn't just about gaining knowledge. It was also fun! The poker run turned out great for me — I received the 3rd place prize! The dinner event and scavenger hunt at the Fargo Air Museum was a great opportunity to meet new people and enjoy some great food. The Murder Mystery Event, "Lights! Camera! For the Excellence Awards the seven categories SDACTE members are eligible for include:

- New Teacher of the Year
- Teacher of the Year
- Postsecondary Teacher of the Year
- Career Guidance Award, Administrator of the Year
- Carl Perkins Community Service Award
- Lifetime Achievement Award

Non-members are eligible for their support of CTE in two award categories:
South Dakota Award of Merit
South Dakota Friend of Career and
Technical Education Award

More information on the specifics for each category can be found on our SDACTE website at <a href="acteonline.org/">acteonline.org/</a> <a href="awards">awards</a>. The winner in each category for the Excellence Awards will advance to Region V competition.

Once those winners are determined, I would highly recommend that the individual who is up for the award be the person filling out the application. Only that person can really address the questions and experiences to adequately complete that application. The application deadline is July 1. Winners will be announced during the state conference at the end of July. Depending upon how your division handles the process, if you would like to recommend a worthy individual in your division, please contact your division chair.
