Katy Blatnick-Gagne



Katy Blatnick-Gagne is a seasoned CTE professional. With educational roots in family and consumer sciences (FCS) education, Blatnick-Gagne has had the opportunity to teach high school FCS; work in Colorado and Iowa at the state level overseeing a wide variety CTE initiatives; serve as the director of the Curriculum Center for Family and Consumer Sciences in Lubbock, Texas; and was a FCSE faculty member at Texas Tech University. She and her family moved to Iowa

in 2019 where Blatnick-Gagne became the CTE curriculum facilitator in the Waukee Community School District. Blatnick-Gagne received her doctorate in educational technology leadership from New Jersey City University in 2017. She lives outside of Des Moines, Iowa, with her husband, two boys (10 and 13), four dogs, many chickens, ducks, geese, guinea hens, and a big pig named Jet.



Scott Spurgeon

Scott Spurgeon is superintendent of the Western Maricopa Education Center (West-MEC) and an educator with more than 30 years of experience serving communities in rural, suburban, and urban school districts. CareerSafe Safety Educator of the Year

CareerSafe was founded under the core belief that no job is worth a young worker's life. Their vision is to advance and enhance OSHA's outreach by providing every young worker with workplace safety training prior to taking their first job. From safety and health training to employability skills and cyber awareness, CareerSafe is focused on providing the foundational skills learners need to launch successful careers.

The Safety Educator of the Year Award recognizes exceptional educators who have not only dedicated their time to prepare students for the future but who have also helped students recognize and mitigate workplace hazards in their chosen careers. The winning educator receives a \$5,000 cash prize for their classroom and a national recognition of their program at ACTE's CareerTech VISION.

Jamie Everett is the assistant director of career development over CTE in Leander Independent School District (ISD), near Austin,

Texas. Leander ISD offers student experiences in 13 career clusters and more than 40 programs of study, giving students real-world learning experiences. Everett is in her 14th year of education including experience in Texas, New Jersey, and Kansas. In addition to serving in her current role, she has taught CTE courses, served as a career and technical student organization (CTSO) adviser, and held many leadership/committee positions supporting CTE at local, state, and national levels.

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ACTE Business-education Partnership Awards

These awards celebrate the contributions and achievements of schools and businesses that aid in the development and maintenance of partnerships supporting high-quality CTE.



Business Education Partnership Over 100: Don Wood Foundation Fort Wayne, Indiana

The Don Wood Foundation was established in 2018 to honor the legacy of Don Wood, co-founder of 80/20. The foundation emerged to address a skilled labor shortage in the manufacturing industry and nurture qualities such as leadership development, sales training, and entrepreneurial education. Don Wood envisioned a future wherein students could pursue fulfilling careers in industrial trades, advanced manufacturing, leadership and innovation, regardless of the common perception that success relied solely on a four-year degree. His dream encompassed equipping all learners with the necessary tools, skills and scholarships to thrive in these crucial fields.

The ongoing partnership between Indiana CTE and the Don Wood Foundation has yielded many positive outcomes. One significant outcome is the provision of upgraded equipment and materials to enhance CTE pathways in manufacturing, welding and precision machining. This support has been instrumental in improving the quality of education and training for students in these areas, ultimately preparing them for the workforce.



Business Education Partnership Under 100: Ace Electric, Inc. Valdosta, Georgia

The Ace Electric and Lowndes High School Worked-based Learning partnership was designed to address a critical

labor shortage in the commercial and electrical construction industry. This labor shortage was exacerbated by the average employee age steadily increasing over the last decade with many retirements, and a lack of student awareness and recruiting in the electrical contracting trade. In short, Ace's high school internship program, AMPED, was formed out of necessity.

The result of this partnership was as intended. A talent pipeline was developed from Lowndes High School to ACE Electric; to address a critical labor shortage. This was accomplished by providing early access to talent resulting in a local employer gaining a competitive advantage to retain said talent. This talent was invested in further by a partnering postsecondary institution, which provided the credentialing necessary to register these students as apprentices with the Department of Labor.

ACTE Champion for CTE Award

This award recognizes education leaders, business and industry executives, celebrities, and thought leaders who support and champion CTE programs as a vital part of developing a prepared, adaptable and competitive workforce.



Jerry Farley VIce President of Career and Technical Education at Oakmont Education Akron. Ohio

Jerry Farley is an educator with more than 35 years of experience, including roles as a direct care worker, classroom teacher, building administrator and school superintendent. His approach unites comprehensive support, industry

credentialing, and hands-on job experience. Farley develops programs that provide students with the opportunity to realize their unique "life after high school" dreams while ensuring the ability to earn a sustainable living wage.

Farley has spent his career advocating for the students who are "forgotten about" in public education as he designs and builds CTE credentialing programs that can be adapted to meet the needs of students and their lives. This has been his life's work and his life's journey. The students he serves face a variety of barriers, systemic and personal, to success in education; Farley not only builds programs that set up these students for sustainable careers, but he also has the forethought to design additional services.

Farley has moved mountains at the state and national levels by continually advocating for dropout recovery students. The work he has done has changed the face of CTE for all students in Ohio. He holds a doctorate in educational leadership and policy analysis from East Tennessee State University and bachelor's and master's degrees in special education from Belmont Abbey College in North Carolina.
