47\% of Montana workers are trained at this level.
Career and technical education (CTE) programs can fill these gaps, particularly in Montana's key industries, like:

- advanced and traditional manufacturing
- agriculture and ag tech
- energy and energy tech
- ecommerce and logistics

In Montana, about 30\% of dually enrolled students take CTE courses.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Montana, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based experiences with industry partners. During the 2021-22 school year, Montana had:
