## **CTE in Montana**

The Montana economy is experiencing a skills gap...

**51%** of jobs in Montana require skills training— more education than high school but less than a four-year degree.

**47%** of Montana workers are trained at this level.

Career and technical education (CTE) programs can fill these gaps, particularly in Montana's key industries, like:

- advanced and traditional manufacturing
- agriculture and ag tech •
- energy and energy tech
- ecommerce and logistics

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Montana, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based experiences with industry partners. During the 2021-22 school year, Montana had:


