## **CTE in Illinois**

30% of Illinois jobs will require education beyond high school but less than a bachelor's degree by 2031. Career and technical education (CTE) programs prepare students for these jobs in key Illinois industries such as:



- advanced manufacturing
- energy
- agribusiness and food processing
- transportation, distribution, and logistics









In 2023, more than 5,400 Illinois high school CTE concentrators passed a work-based learning course prior to exit.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Illinois, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based experiences with industry partners. During the 2022-23 school year, Illinois had:


