

CTE in Louisiana



31% of Louisiana jobs will require education beyond high school but less than a bachelor's degree by 2031. Career and technical education (CTE) programs prepare students for these jobs in key Louisiana industries such as:

- military/defense
- entertainment
- water management
- process industries



In 2023, more than 46,000 Louisiana high school CTE concentrators graduated with a recognized postsecondary credential.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Louisiana, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based experiences with industry partners. During the 2022-23 school year, Louisiana had:

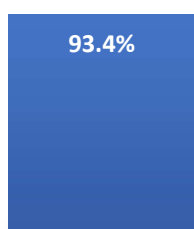

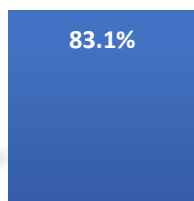
