CTE in Utah

35% of Utah jobs will require education beyond high school but less than a bachelor's degree by 2031. Career and technical education (CTE) programs prepare students for these jobs in key Utah industries such as:



- advanced manufacturing
- aerospace and defense
- life sciences and health care
- financial services









Utah high school students earned more than 191,000 industry certifications in 2023-24.

Many students are enrolled in CTE in Utah, developing technical, academic, and employability skills, and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.


