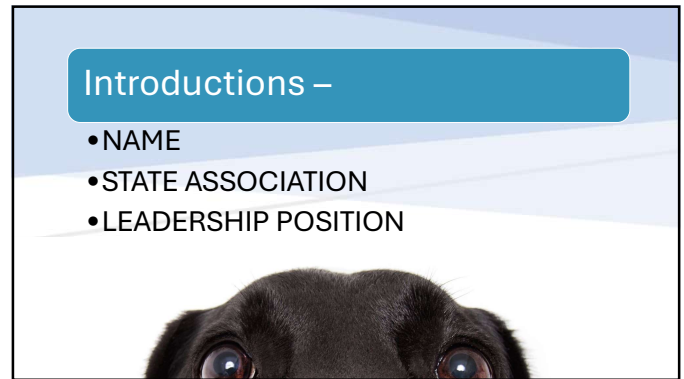


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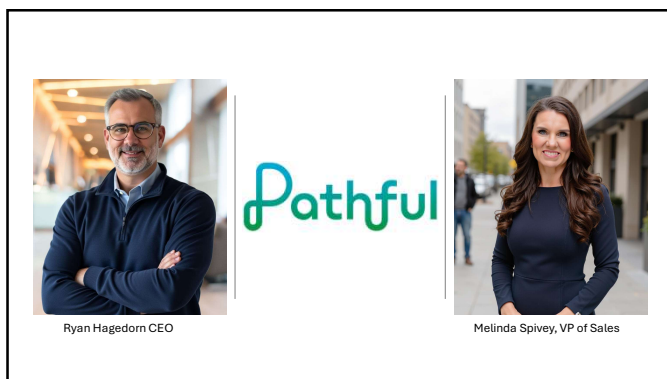
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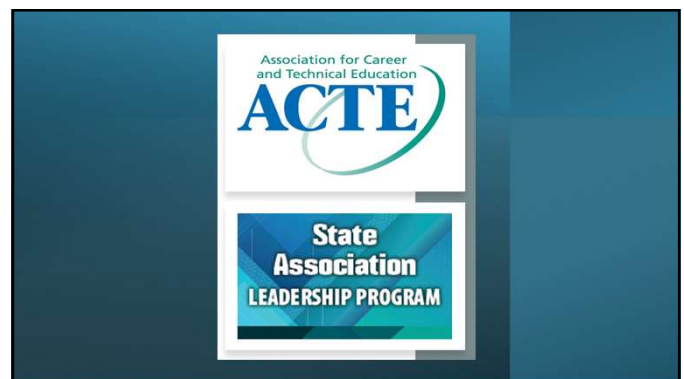

**Quality Association Standards (QAS)**

- Purpose of the QAS:**
  - Provide benchmarks for state associations to assess performance levels.
  - Help evaluate the quality of service offered to members and prospective members.
- Key Objectives:**
  - Aid states in assessing their organizational structure.
  - Determine whether leadership is delivering minimum, average, or superior programs for members.
- Clarifications:**
  - QAS is not a competition between states or a tool to create a "class system" of associations.
  - It is not designed to evaluate the performance of a state's executive director or volunteer leaders.

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**CRITERION EIGHT:  
PUBLIC POLICY**

The association must demonstrate that it has established a list of clearly defined issues which are monitored regularly through analysis and reporting, and whose findings are communicated to the members and the outside public in a timely way. The association must show that there is adequate funding for a public policy program at all levels, that it is successful in gaining access to key decision makers, and that it has shown success in achieving its goals.



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**Public Policy**

The association leadership regularly evaluates current issues and establishes relevant association policies.

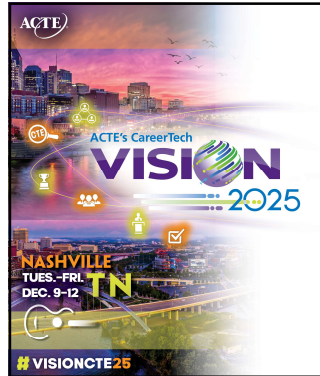
A clearly defined process is used to develop policy positions for the association that includes timely dissemination of current information to key government decision-makers.

There is a system in place to disseminate accurate analysis of pending issues to members including the mobilization of members for legislative action.

The association has established specific procedures and contact points to facilitate prompt responses to inquiries from lawmakers, legislative staff, and agency officials.

The association has demonstrated an ability to use a range of techniques in presenting its views to policy-makers, including formal testimony, informal contacts, member contacts, and other appropriate means.

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## Definition of Lobbying

- **LOBBYING ACTIVITIES .**—The term “lobbying activities” means lobbying contacts and efforts in support of such contacts, including preparation and planning activities, research and other background work that is intended, at the time it is performed, for use in contacts, and coordination with the lobbying activities of others.

- **LOBBYING CONTACT.**—  
(A) **DEFINITION.**—The term “lobbying contact” means any oral or written communication (including an electronic communication) to a covered executive branch official or a covered legislative branch official that is made on behalf of a client with regard to—  
 (i) the formulation, modification, or adoption of Federal legislation (including legislative proposals);  
 (ii) the formulation, modification, or adoption of a Federal rule, regulation, Executive order, or any other program, policy, or position of the United States Government;  
 (iii) the administration or execution of a Federal program or policy (including the negotiation, award, or administration of a Federal contract, grant, loan, permit, or license); or  
 (iv) the nomination or confirmation of a person for a position subject to confirmation by the Senate.  
 • Exceptions include mass communications; a request for a meeting, a request for the status of an action, or any other similar administrative request; testimony given before a committee, subcommittee, or task force of the Congress; information provided in writing in response to a request

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## MI CTE Project

The Michigan Department of Labor, Economic & Opportunity-Workforce Development (LEO-WD) has partnered with CAST on a 3-year initiative to increase access to quality professional development (PD) for postsecondary career technical education (CTE) programs statewide.

- Year 1: Program Gap Analysis, Literature Review, Statewide Advisory Board
- Year 2: Free PD courses, tailored PD, monthly webinars
- Year 3: Promote a central repository for CTE instructional modules and best practices



- Conduct a gap analysis & literature review
- Form a state-wide advisory board
- Collect the PD needs of post-secondary CTE teachers in MI (from educators/instructors)
- Create 4 free online courses for MI CTE
- Create an addition 5 courses designed and developed by Post-secondary Educators in MI
- Publish on findings and approaches
- Promote a centralized repository for MI CTE specific instructional modules and best practices

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## MI Findings Align with National Findings...


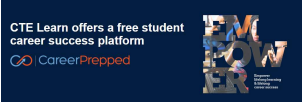
Most post-secondary CTE educators report little or no appropriate on-boarding and do not truly understand their responsibilities (Thierer, 2021)

“...so overwhelming [.] like drinking out of a fire hose” - CTE faculty moving from industry to academia (Thierer, 2021)

Faculty training on disability is limited and disability training designed for CTE faculty specifically is nearly non-existent (Carballo et al., 2021; Morifu & Carballo, 2017).
