

CTE in Alabama



Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key Alabama industries such as:



ag tech and food products



metals and advanced materials



aerospace and aviation



operation and logistics

In 2024, Alabama high school students earned more than 45,300 industry-recognized credentials, a 12,000 increase from the previous year.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Alabama, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.


