

CTE in Alaska



Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key Alaska industries such as:



health care and social assistance



transportation and warehousing



arts, entertainment and recreation



operation and logistics

In 2024, 75% of Alaska high school CTE concentrators were employed, pursued further education or joined the military or Peace Corps immediately after graduation.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Alaska, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.

During the 2023-24 school year, Alaska had:

secondary CTE participants

3,338


postsecondary CTE participants
