Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key Connecticut industries such as:



insurance



green energy



advanced manufacturing



bioscience and health care

In 2024, 95% of Connecticut postsecondary CTE concentrators earned an industry-recognized credential, certificate or degree.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Connecticut, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.


