

CTE in Florida

Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key Florida industries such as:



manufacturing



life sciences



aviation and
aerospace



information
technology

In 2024, over 228,000 Florida high school students enrolled in at least one career-themed course or a career academy, an increase of 23,000 students from the previous year.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Florida, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.


