

CTE in Indiana



Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key Indiana industries such as:



health and life sciences



building and construction



IT and business services



advanced manufacturing

In 2024, over 15,000 secondary CTE concentrators in Indiana earned at least nine postsecondary credits in their CTE program.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Indiana, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.

71,702


