Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key Mississippi industries such as:



advanced manufacturing



energy



construction



healthcare

In 2024, 91% of Mississippi secondary CTE concentrators participated in work-based learning before graduating.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Mississippi, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.


