

CTE in New Hampshire



Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key New Hampshire industries such as:



advanced manufacturing



tourism and hospitality



construction



outdoor recreation

In 2024, 66% of New Hampshire high school CTE concentrators graduated having participated in work-based learning.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in New Hampshire, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.


