

CTE in New York



Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key New York industries such as:



health care and social assistance



making & creating: construction and advanced manufacturing



accommodation and food services



transportation and warehousing

In 2024, more than 19,300 New York secondary CTE concentrators completed at least 54 hours of work-based learning before graduating.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in New York, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.


