Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key Oregon industries such as:



health sciences



high technology



manufacturing



transportation

There are other industries important to Oregon's economy not listed here.

In 2024, more than 5,300 Oregon postsecondary CTE concentrators earned a recognized postsecondary credential.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Oregon, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.

44,702


