Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key Rhode Island industries such as:



ocean economy



advanced business services



design and custom manufacturing



arts, education, hospitality and tourism

In 2024, more than 3,600 Rhode Island secondary CTE concentrators participated in work-based learning.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Rhode Island, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.

14,696


postsecondary CTE participants
