

# CTE in Tennessee



Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key Tennessee industries such as:



food and beverage



aerospace and defense



health care and life sciences



electric vehicle manufacturing

In 2023, more than 19,000 Tennessee high school CTE concentrators graduated having met at least one of the Ready Graduate indicator measures.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Tennessee, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.


