

CTE in West Virginia



Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key West Virginia industries such as:



automotive



film



food and agriculture



fulfillment distribution

In 2024, 97% of West Virginia secondary CTE concentrators pursued postsecondary education, joined the military or the Peace Corps, or entered the workforce immediately after graduation.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in West Virginia, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.


