Across Delaware, over 8,200 students participated in work-based learning opportunities in 2023-24.

12,736

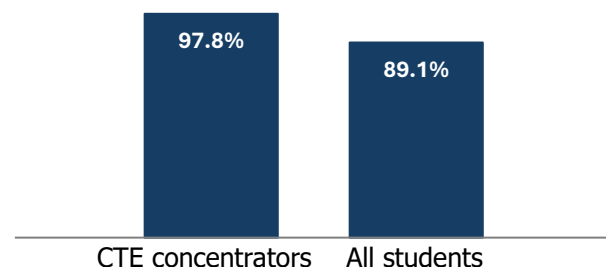
