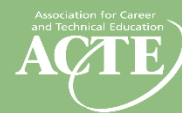


CTAE in Georgia



Career, technical and agricultural education (CTAE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key Georgia industries such as:

Across Georgia, 35,283 students and more than 23,000 employers participated in work-based learning in 2023-24.

Many students are already enrolled in CTAE in Georgia, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.

88,344

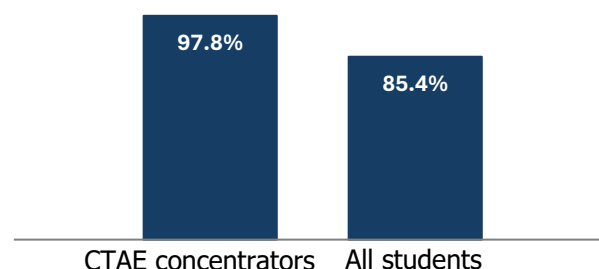
postsecondary CTAE participants
