

CTE in Idaho



Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key Idaho industries such as:



aerospace



outdoor recreation



food production



energy

In 2024, over 3,300 high school students in Idaho earned a Workforce Readiness and CTE High School Diploma, nearly double the number of students in 2022.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Idaho, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.

5,771

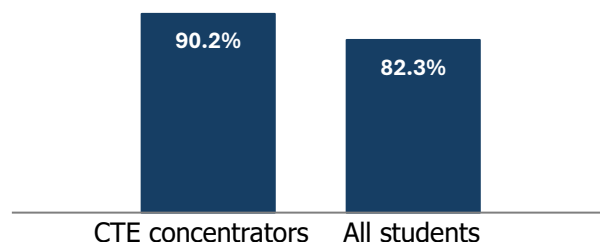
