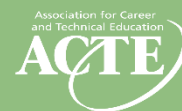


CTE in Kentucky

In 2024, over 13,500 Kentucky high school seniors earned an industry-recognized credential.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Kentucky, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.

34,139

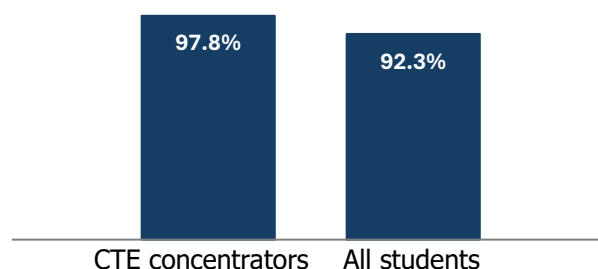
postsecondary CTE participants
