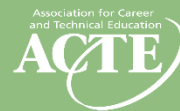


CTE in Massachusetts



Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key Massachusetts industries such as:



financial services



life sciences



clean, green and blue technologies



aerospace, defense and robotics

In 2024, more than 87% of Massachusetts high school CTE concentrators participated in work-based learning before graduating.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Massachusetts, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.

44,307

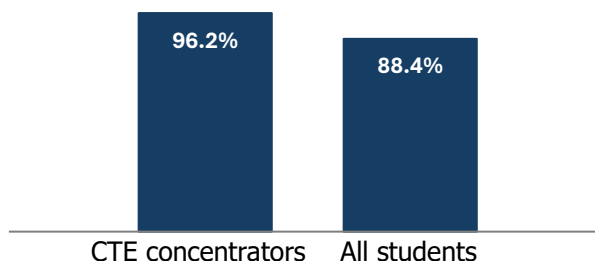
postsecondary CTE participants
