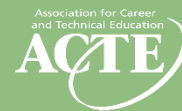


CTE in Minnesota



Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key Minnesota industries such as:

In 2024, over 5,200 Minnesota high school CTE concentrators completed at least one work-based learning course prior to graduation.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Minnesota, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.

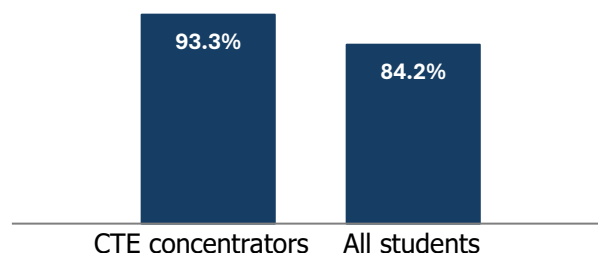
