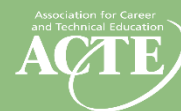


CTE in Montana



Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key Montana industries such as:



cyber-security and networking



agriculture and agtech



manufacturing and construction



ecommerce and logistics

In 2025, 47% of dual enrollment students in Montana took at least one CTE course as well.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Montana, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.

8,836

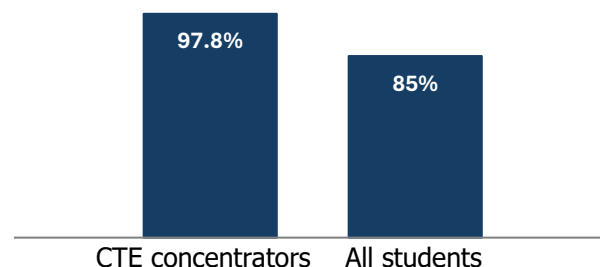
postsecondary CTE participants
