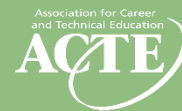


CTE in New Jersey



Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key New Jersey industries such as:



leisure and hospitality



financial services



construction and energy



biopharmaceutical and life sciences

In 2024, more than 12,800 New Jersey high school CTE concentrators participated in work-based learning before graduating.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in New Jersey, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.

57,245

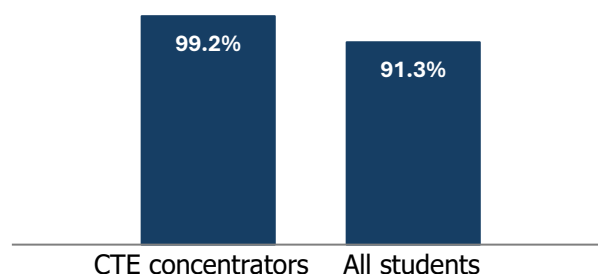
postsecondary CTE participants
