Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key Ohio industries such as:



energy and chemicals



health care



automotive



advanced aerospace and defense

In 2024, 39% of career and technical education students earned one or more of Ohio's in demand, industry-recognized credentials.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Ohio, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.

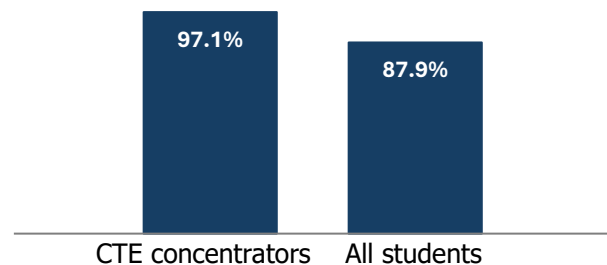
