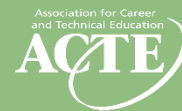


CTE in Pennsylvania



Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key Pennsylvania industries such as:



robotics and technology



life sciences



agriculture



energy

In 2024, 85% of Pennsylvania secondary CTE concentrators earned a recognized postsecondary credential.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Pennsylvania, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.

58,865

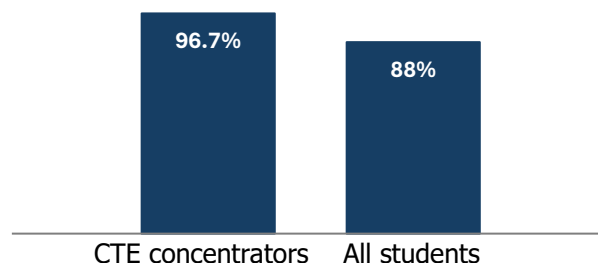
postsecondary CTE participants
