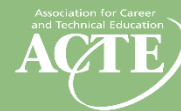


CTE in South Carolina



Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key South Carolina industries such as:



agribusiness



distribution and logistics



aerospace



electric vehicles

In 2024, 97% of South Carolina secondary CTE concentrators pursued postsecondary education, joined the military or the Peace Corps, or entered the workforce immediately after graduation.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in South Carolina, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.

48,966

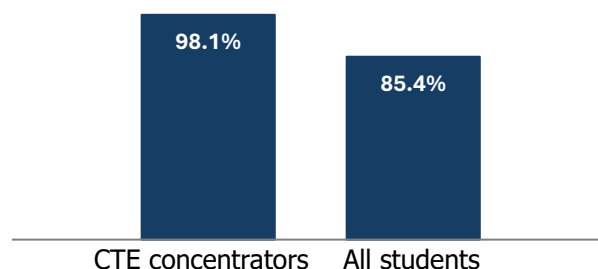
