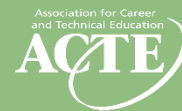


CTE in South Dakota



Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key South Dakota industries such as:



bioscience



cybersecurity



manufacturing



value-added agriculture

In 2024, 93% of South Dakota secondary CTE concentrators pursued postsecondary education, joined the military or the Peace Corps, or entered the workforce immediately after graduation.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in South Dakota, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.

6,316

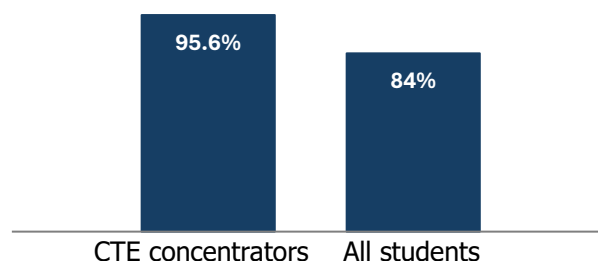
postsecondary CTE participants
