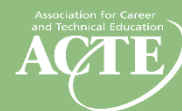


CTE in Vermont



Career and technical education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key Vermont industries such as:



tourism and hospitality



forest products



creative economy



renewable energy

In Vermont, 90% of CTE program graduates transition directly to college or work after graduation.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Vermont, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.

2,786

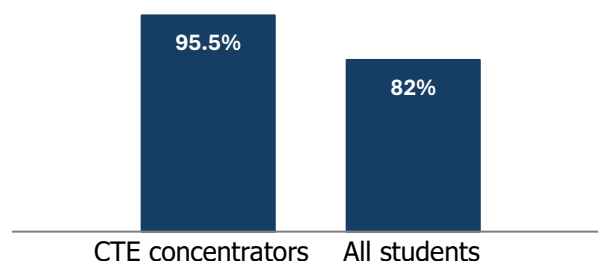
postsecondary CTE participants
