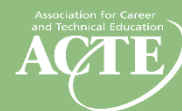


CTE in Washington



Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs equip students with the skills and experience necessary to pursue careers in key Washington industries such as:



aerospace



clean technology



creative economy



maritime

The percentage of students in Washington who earn four or more CTE credits rose from 42% in 2017 to 56% in 2024.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Washington, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based learning experiences with industry partners.

82,707

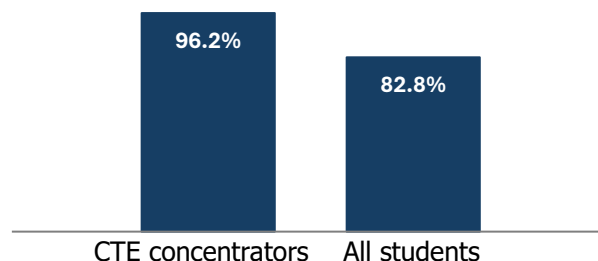
postsecondary CTE participants
